## **Keynote Address—Role of Corrections in System-Wide Criminal Justice Reform and Response to Opioids**

- Provides an example of one state's comprehensive strategy to reform corrections and address the drug epidemic
- · Learn about key state and local actors needed to be involved
- · Discuss legislative reforms enacted to facilitate reform

#### **RSAT/Drug Court Collaborative Models**

- Present several different models of drug court/RSAT program collaborations involving both pre- and postadjudicated defendants
- Provide real life examples and analyze components needed to facilitate collaborations

#### Panel on Prison/Jail MAT Programming in MA, KY, CA, and RI

- Hear from nine panelists from 4 states and the National Institute of Corrections about RSAT-TTA's Center for Innovation host site MAT trainings
- Describe different prison and jail medication assisted treatment models in these states
- Delineate key issues that have arisen in their development and strategies utilized to address them
- Encourage audience to envision introducing or enhancing MAT programs back home

## **Evidence-Based Substance Use Disorder Treatment & Use of Medication Assisted Treatment**

- Update latest science of drug addiction as a brain disease and role of current medications approved for the treatment of opioid use disorder
- Differentiate medications as to their effect on the brain and utility in assisting in opioid or alcohol use disorder treatment
- · Discuss preliminary analysis of the Kentucky prison MAT program

#### **Role of Correction Officers in RSAT Treatment Programs**

- Discuss role of correctional officers in RSAT programs to facilitate and reinforce RSAT treatment objectives
- Provide guidelines on what a correctional officer's role should be, including sanctioning and rewarding behaviors
  of participants
- · Propose strategies for encouraging collaboration between treatment and correctional officer staffs

#### **Health Literacy and Overdose Prevention**

- · Describe what people need to know about proper utilization of preventive and primary health care
- · Outline steps to prevent drug overdose, including administration of naloxone

## Recovery-Oriented Systems of Care in Criminal Justice & Framework for Addressing SUDs and Co-Occurring Disorders

• Present analysis of essential elements for addressing substance use disorders in justice-involved populations with co-occurring drug use and mental health disorders

#### Coordinating Federal Resources and Collaboration Among Grantees

- Provide update on federal opioid overdose prevention and treatment grants available to states and programs
- Describe strategies for collaborating with these and other federal grant programs to better serve justice-involved populations with substance use disorders

#### **Confidentiality Rules and Regulations**

- Layout overview of the 42 CFR Part 2, Confidentiality of Substance Use Disorder Patient Records regulations
- Outline updated federal rules and regulations on confidentiality involving collecting, maintaining and disseminating client data relevant to RSAT personnel

#### **Supporting Evidence-Based Practices**

- Discuss how RSAT programs in two states utilize RSAT data to evaluate themselves
- Define strategies used to improve programming for persons in need of substance use disorder treatment in prison and jails
- Present lessons learned from RSAT aftercare evaluation

## **Promising Practice Guidelines for Medication Assisted Treatment for Justice Involved Populations**

- Highlight findings from national roundtable on promising practices for MAT programming at all criminal justice intercept points with a specific focus on corrections and reentry
