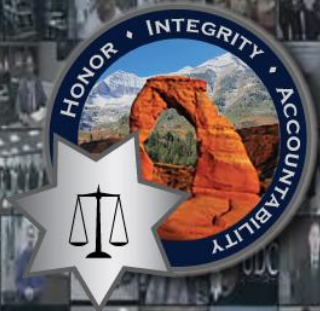
Participant Objectives

Utilization of Government, Private, Non-Profit, and Public Organizations to enhance release and reentry services



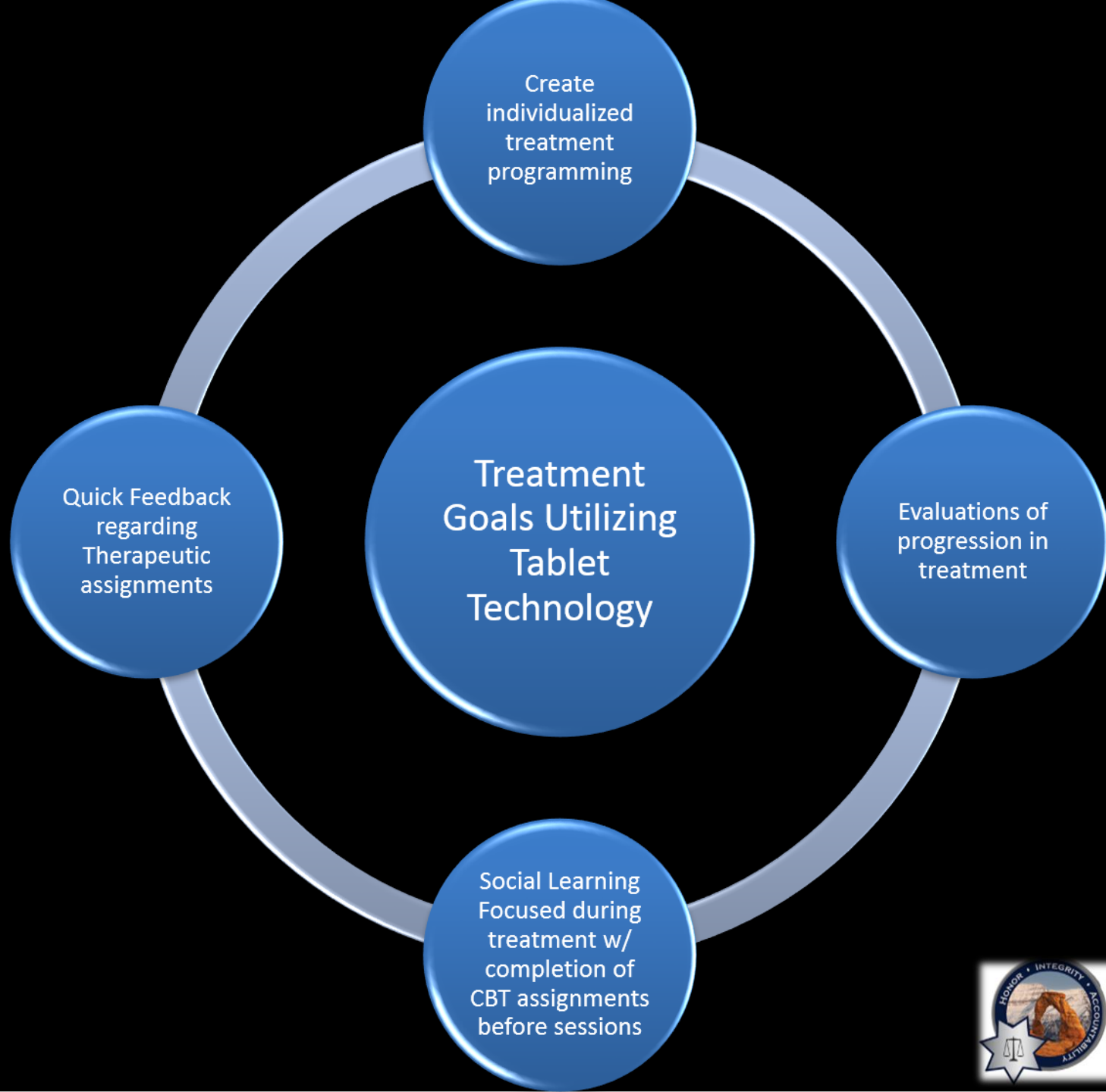
